

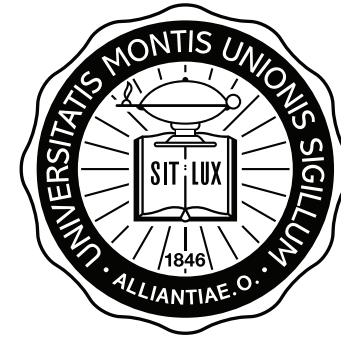
Roger Stewart
