Professional licensure requirements vary from state to state, which may affect a student's ability to apply for a professional license upon the completion of the program. Ohio

Alabama

Alabama recognizes valid professional educator certificates/licenses issued by other states as the basis to offer professional certification. Note that Alabama may have different license types and requirements than Ohio. The University of Mount Union cannot guarantee that an individual student will be eligible for licensure/certification in other states. The following may be required for an Alabama license:

- Valid Professional Educator Certificate issued by another state
- Verification of specific educational experience in grades P-12 for areas of instructional support (educational administration, school counseling, etc.)
- Verification of US Citizenship or Lawful Presence
- Official transcripts of all credits and degrees earned (must hold at least a master's degree for areas of instructional support)
- Degrees must be from a regionally accredited senior institution.

- Official transcripts of all credits and degrees earned (must hold at least a master's degree for areas of instructional support)
 - Degrees must be from a senior institution that was regionally accredited or accredited by the
 Distance Education Accreditation Commission (DEAC) at the time the degree was conferred.
- Verification of licensure tests. Additional testing may be required.
- Background Clearance (if not previously cleared)
- \$30.00 fee (an additional \$30 fee is required for each area of certification for which an individual is eligible)

Alaska

Alaska offers an Initial Out-of-State teacher certificate for educators who are currently certified in another state to teach. This certificate is valid for one year and can be reissued if necessary to meet certificate requirements. Note that Alaska may have different license types and requirements than Ohio. The University of Mount Union cannot guarantee that an individual student will be eligible for licensure/certification in other states. Arizona

The Arizona Department of Education Certification Unit will reciprocate with all states and may issue a comparable teaching, administrative, or professional non-teaching certificate to an applicant who holds a valid, comparable certificate in another state and is in good standing in that other state.

Applicants may also qualify to add additional approved areas or endorsements to existing teaching certificates if they hold a valid, comparable approved area or endorsement in another state. Individuals who qualify under Certification Reciprocity Rules are exempt from Arizona educator exam requirements.

We will not reciprocate expired, temporary, or non-renewable certificates/licenses.

The following documents may be required for an Arizona license under Certification Reciprocity:

- A photocopy of your valid <u>Arizona Department of Public Safety Identity Verified Prints (IVP)</u> fingerprint clearance card.
- A photocopy of your valid, comparable out-of-state educator certificate or National Board Certificate.
 - Submit a photocopy with your application.
- Your official transcripts submitted to certification@azed.gov by your institution.

- Exams or work experience are not required under reciprocity rules.
- The fee is \$60 per certificate, endorsement, or approved area. Per Board-rule certification fees are non-refundable.

Arkansas

Arkansas will not automatically grant licensure for applicants who are licensed in another state or country. Request a Reciprocity packet from ADE by emailing ade.educatorlicensure@ade.arkansas.gov. California

California evaluates applicants if they have obtained a license in another state. Note that California may have different license types and requirements than Ohio and requirements vary between licensure areas, such as elementary, middle, secondary, and administration. The University of Mount Union cannot guarantee that an individual student will be eligible for licensure/certification in other states. The following may be required for a CA license:

- Background check.
- Application fee up to \$100 is required for an out-of-state application.

Colorado

Colorado evaluates applicants if they have obtained a license in another state. Note that Colorado may have different license types and requirements than Ohio. The University of Mount Union cannot guarantee that an individual student will be eligible for licensure/certification in other states. Applicants for initial educator license in Colorado should:

- You must hold a valid license issued by another state for the initial CO license.
- Testing requirements are dependent upon the review of a completed application.
- Complete the application form.
- Satisfy background check requirements.
- Application fee of up to \$110 is required for an out-of-state application

Connecticut

Connecticut does not have reciprocity with Ohio; however, if you have a teaching certificate in another U.S. State or territory, you may qualify for Connecticut certification. Note that Connecticut may have different license types and requirements than Ohio. Reciprocity for Out-of-state Teachers and Administrators

Florida has two reciprocity routes for certified <u>teachers</u> and <u>administrators</u> to qualify for our Professional Certificate.

Route 1: Valid Standard Certificate Issued by a State Other than Florida

- The certificate shall be the valid standard educator's certificate issued by that state which is comparable to a Florida Professional Certificate, and
- Be issued in a subject comparable to a Florida certification subject, and
- · Require the same or higher level of training required for certification in that subject in Florida, and
- The certificate must be currently valid (not expired or revoked).

Route 2: Certificate Issued by the National Board for Professional Teaching Standards (NBPTS)

- The NBPTS certificate must be currently valid.
- The Florida certificate will reflect the Florida subject considered comparable to the NBPTS subject.

Michigan

Michigan evaluates applicant who have completed a teacher preparation programs from state-approved, regionally accredited colleges and university. Michigan has signed an Interstate Compact Agreement (ICA) with every state agreeing to accept out-of-state teacher preparation programs and teaching certificates on a reciprocal basis for initial certification. However, the terms of the agreement address both traditional teacher preparation programs and alternative route teacher certification programs and each certificate and/or program must be evaluated under the terms of this agreement. Out-of-state certification programs and credentials may differ from Michigan programs and credentials; however, under the ICA, the Department attempts to match out-of-state certificates, grade levels and content endorsements, as closely as possible.

To determine reciprocity under the ICA, an evaluation must be completed. For this to happen, an application must be submitted using the <u>Michigan Online Educator Certification System</u> (MOECS). MOECS will determine the certificate type (standard or professional) being applied for based on answers to the application questions. Accurate responses and supporting documentation are required. Reciprocity notwithstanding, Michigan certification is not guaranteed, and ancillary state requirements exist in Michigan law (e.g., testing).

Note that Michigan may have different license types and requirements than Ohio. - Submit application.

- Application fee up to \$190 is required for an out-of-state application.

New Mexico

New Mexico will evaluate applicants who have completed a minimum of a bachelor's degree from a regionally accredited college/university, copy of out-of-state license, verification of work experience (if applicable, required for administration), and passage of state licensure exams. Note that New Mexico may have different license types and requirements than Ohio. The University of Mount Union cannot guarantee that an individual student will be eligible for licensure/certification in other states. - Submit state test licensing exams (if applicable). Note that you may have to take NC exams if no teaching experience. Three years will be given to successfully complete the exams.
- Submit verification of educator effectiveness data (for administrative license)
- Application fee of \$100 is required for an out-of-state application.

North Dakota

North Dakota encourage anyone who completed a teaching degree outside of ND to get a teaching license in the state where the degree was earned. This would enable you to then apply for an Other State Educator License (OSEL) and not have to meet ND standards (as you met the standards in the state the degree was earned.) If you are not able to get a teaching license in the state your degree was earned, then you will need to apply for an Out of State Reciprocal License and you will need to meet ND standards. A license can be issued, and you could have up to 4 years to meet ND requirements. Note that North Dakota may have different license types and requirements than Ohio. Oklahoma

- Completed verification form (Education Preparation Program Verification Form, PDE338A).
- Experience verification for the administrative certificate.
- Review all test requirements for PA. There may be additional tests required to obtain certification.
- Complete and submit the application and other required materials in TIMS.
- Application fee of \$260 is required for an out-of-state application.

Rhode Island

Rhode Island will evaluate applicants who competed a state approved out-of-state preparation program or who hold a valid full out-of-state certificate. Note that Rhode Island may have different license types and requirements than Ohio. - For administrative license, submit Experience Verification Form completed by employers.
- Application fee of \$105 is required for an out-of-state application.
